A career in aviation will take you places. For many years, Australia has been one of the world's leading aviation countries with the Australian Commercial Pilot's Licence (CPL) highly regarded around the world and recognised by the International Civil Aviation Organisation (ICAO). A wider range of career opportunities beckon with a completion of a Bachelor of Aviation Technology.

International students who seek a career in aviation need to be aware of the English requirements mandated by Australian and international aviation authorities. Australian Wings Academy (AWA) requires that international students have an IELTS score of 6.0 or equivalent for their flight training to be effective and safe.

AWA has an arrangement with Queensland International Business Academy (QIBA) to provide students with English training to ensure they meet this level.

Upon successful completion of the AWA's Diploma of Aviation, graduates will gain direct entry (with five exemptions) to the Bachelor of Aviation Technology awarded by CQUniversity Australia.

Step 1

Stage I – General English (20 hours per week)
This is designed for students who have less than IELTS Band 5.0 or equivalent performance. When students reach IELTS 5.0, they can commence the English for Aviation program.

Stage II – English for Aviation (25 hours per week)
This is a 24 week specific purpose English language program for trainee pilots with a non-English speaking background designed in cooperation with Australian Wings Academy.

The program develops Aviation industry-specific terminology and phraseology and helps in the preparation for the International Civil Aviation Organisation (ICAO) Aural Competency (ALITE) Test.

The aim is to get students' performance up to at least IELTS Band 6 and a minimum of ICAO level 4. This is an absolute minimum requirement for aviation specialists. (Pilots-in-command and Air Traffic Controllers).

Students usually follow a combination of several stages (I and II), depending on their prior English studies and exam credentials. When students reach IELTS 5.0, they can commence the English for Aviation program. If in doubt, QIBA can administer a placement test to help with the planning of the most suitable program.

Step 2

Commercial Pilot Licence and Diploma of Aviation
The Commercial Pilot Licence (CPL) is a 150 flight hour course which fully integrates flight training and theory and covers all components required by CASA. The course includes 70 solo hours and 8 theory subjects. The CPL course duration is 52 weeks.

Once a student has completed the CPL, they are eligible for entry into the Diploma of Aviation.

The diploma meets all the requirements of the Australian Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA). The program is made up of 45 hours of flight training and includes:

- 23 hours dual instruction in a synthetic trainer
- 22 hours dual instruction in a twin engine aircraft
- three hours flight test for Instrument Rating in a twin engine aircraft
- 22 hours pre and post flight briefings

The AWA course covers all Nav Aids including NDB, VOR, ILS and GPS/RNAV; students can select which navaids they require and commit all the course hours to those aids.
