COURSE

Australian Wings Academy offers a Diploma Course which enhances the Commercial Pilots Licence (CPL) with a Multi Engine Instrument Rating (MECIR). The Diploma of Aviation course takes place after the completion of the Commercial Pilots Licence. The Diploma meets all the requirements of the Australian Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA).

SYLLABUS & OUTLINE

The AWA syllabus is made up of 45 hours of flight training which includes all components required by CASA, and is made up of;

- 23 hours dual instruction in a synthetic trainer
- 17 hours dual instruction in a twin engine aircraft
- 2 hours dual instruction in a single engine IFR aircraft
- 3 hours flight test for Instrument Rating in a twin engine aircraft
- 22 hours pre and post flight briefings

The AWA course covers all Nav Aids including NDB, VOR, ILS and GPS/RNAV; students can select which navaids they require and commit all the course hours to those aids.

COURSE MANAGEMENT

All flight training is conducted one on one with a senior instructor and the flight test is conducted by a CASA approved testing officer. Theory classes are done in our state of the art training facility. AWA has the skill and expertise to manage the course with proficiency checks to ensure students are progressing satisfactorily. Should a student fail to meet the required standard at each check, a review will be undertaken by a senior instructor and remedial training prescribed. The student will be reassessed following the remedial training and may proceed once performance is satisfactory. In these cases students will be charged for the additional tuition and flight hours.

PRE REQUISITES

Hold a current Commercial Pilot Licence which includes;

- 50 hours of cross country command (PIC) flight time and 5 hours PIC at night
- Minimum IELTS 5.5 (or equivalent English capability)
- CASA set and marked theory (IREX) exam must be successfully completed prior to the flight test.

COURSE OUTLINE

- IREX Theory Course
- Endorsement on a multi-engine aircraft
- Instrument Flight Training
 - 23 hours dual synthetic trainer
 - 22 hours dual instrument flying training in aircraft

OUTCOMES

Qualifies you to fly as PIC or Co-Pilot under Instrument Flight Rules in a twin engine aircraft.

INCLUDES

- All equipment and material needed to complete the course including text books, charts and maps
- Air services charges, landing fees, ILS and enroute charges
- Pre and post flight briefings
- Test fees for one attempt at each exam. If the student requires more than one test to pass any exam, the test fee for each additional test will be charged to students at published rates at the time.
